Litany of Call

All: Gracious God to whom we belong, we know...

that each person is of infinite worth to You, that You delight in all our colours, shapes, and sizes, and that You dwell in the love that holds us together. Help us, merciful God, to hear your call to each and all of us.

(silent listening for God's 'Voice' to each and all of us)

One: A child once dreamed the Voice was calling his name... 'Samuel'; fisher folk once heard the Voice when a young Galilean name Jesus bid them follow, and still the Voice beckons today; can you hear it?

Many: We are trying to hear, but we confess that we live in a world held captive by the bondage of racism, we confess that at times we have failed to love boldly – thereby alienating ourselves from you, from one another, and even from our very souls.

One: We remember that Moses protested strongly as the Voice spoke at the burning bush; Mary stood amazed as the Voice proclaimed impending birth; and still the Voice beckons today... can you hear it?

Many: We do hear, and so we ask you to help us find strength in you; to stop quietly accepting the system that divides, excludes, and crucifies your Body. Source of all that is just and true, fortify us with the courage and integrity to act with sincere passion for justice.

One: Rosa Parks followed the Voice to boycott injustice; Martin Luther King, Jr. heard the Voice even up until the bullet shattered his throat; and still the Voice beckons today... can you hear?

Many: Embolden us, O God, to practice radical loving regard toward all.

One: The Voice beckons from humble places... in the tears of hungry children, in the cries of the frail and frightened elderly, in groans of the oppressed and the refugee, in the pleas of those whose dreams for peace, justice and wholeness have been too long deferred; and still the Voice beckons today... can you hear?

Many: God, "we" want to be part of the solution; "I" want to be a part of the solution. Here I am. Send me!

One: A timid believer pauses to listen to the Voice; a questioner stops to ponder whose Voice this might be; a curious teenager is attracted to the Voice who is calling out to take up a life of purpose; an attentive church hears the Voice and obeys; still the Voice beckons today... can you hear?

Many: God, because of you and others standing right here all around me who are listening to the Voice, I am feeling empowered and brave. So I shout: HERE I AM, SEND ME!

Reader & People (Psalm 146: 1-3): Praise the LORD. Praise the LORD, my soul. I will praise the LORD all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I live. Do not put your trust in princes, in human beings, who cannot save.

Dr. King's words

"Something must happen so as to touch the hearts and souls of men (and women) that they will come together, not because the law says it, but because it is natural and right.... Only through non-violence can this goal be attained, for the aftermath of non-violence is reconciliation and the creation of the beloved community!"

Reader and People: (Psalm 119:1-2)

Blessed are they whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the Lord. Blessed are they who keep his commandments and seek him with all their heart.

Dr. King's words: "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter...Life's most persistent and urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?' The question is not whether we will be extremists, but what kind of extremists we will be. Will we be extremists for hate or for love.... Love is the only force capable of transforming an enemy into "a friend."

Reader and People (Psalm 146: 7-8): He upholds the cause of the oppressed and gives food to the hungry. The LORD sets prisoners free, the LORD gives sight to the blind, the LORD lifts up those who are bowed down, the LORD loves the righteous.

Dr. King's words: "I'd like somebody to mention...that Martin

Luther King, Jr. tried to give his life serving others. I'd like for somebody to say... that Martin Luther King, Jr. tried to love somebody... If I can do my duty as a Christian ought; if I can bring salvation to a world once wrought; if I can spread the message the Master taught, then my living will not be in vain."

People (Psalm 36:5-6) Your love, O Lord, reaches to the heavens, your faithfulness to the skies. Your righteousness is like the mighty mountains, your justice like the great deep. O Lord, you preserve both mortal and beast.

Dr. King's words: "The person who passively accepts evil is as much involved in it as the one who helps perpetrate it. The person who accepts evil without protesting against it, is really cooperating with it....Yes, if you want to say I was a drum major, say that I was a drum major for justice; say that I was a drum major for peace; I was a drum major for righteousness. And all of the other shallow things will not matter."

Donations to Parkdale

There are several ways to make a donation to Parkdale:

- 1. Cash or cheques can be added to the offering plate that is circulated each Sunday. To receive a tax receipt, you can use a blue envelope (supplies are in the pews) and provide your name and address
- 2. Personal boxes of envelopes are provided on request. They will be available for 2024 near the end of this year. You can place cash or a cheque in your uniquely numbered envelope and add it to the offering plate that is circulated each Sunday. Tax receipts will be provided after the end of each calendar year.
- 3. Donations can also be made directly through your bank account or credit card using Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR). Givings are deducted automatically from your bank account or charged to your credit card once a month. PAR forms and information can be printed from the church website; parkdaleunitedchurch.ca
- 4. E-transfer: donations can be made by sending an e-transfer to deposits@parkdaleunitedchurch.ca. Make sure you note what the donation is for and provide your name and address information for a tax receipt.
- 5. Canada Helps is an agency that accepts donations for Canadian charities for a small fee, and then forwards the donation to the church. Canada Helps issues the tax receipt. There is a link to Canada Helps on the Parkdale website.
