Dr. King once said, “The person who passively accepts evil is as much involved in it as the one who helps perpetrate it. The person who accepts evil without protesting against it, is really cooperating with it.” Let us take a moment and reflect on the times when Jesus has not been the centre that guides us. Let us reflect on the times when we have been complicit by action and omission in that which has fractured relationships with ourselves, one another, creation, and God.

God of justice and mercy, you call us to speak prophetically amid difficult times. We admit that sometimes we are unwilling to give up our comfort and safety to follow where your voice leads us.
